

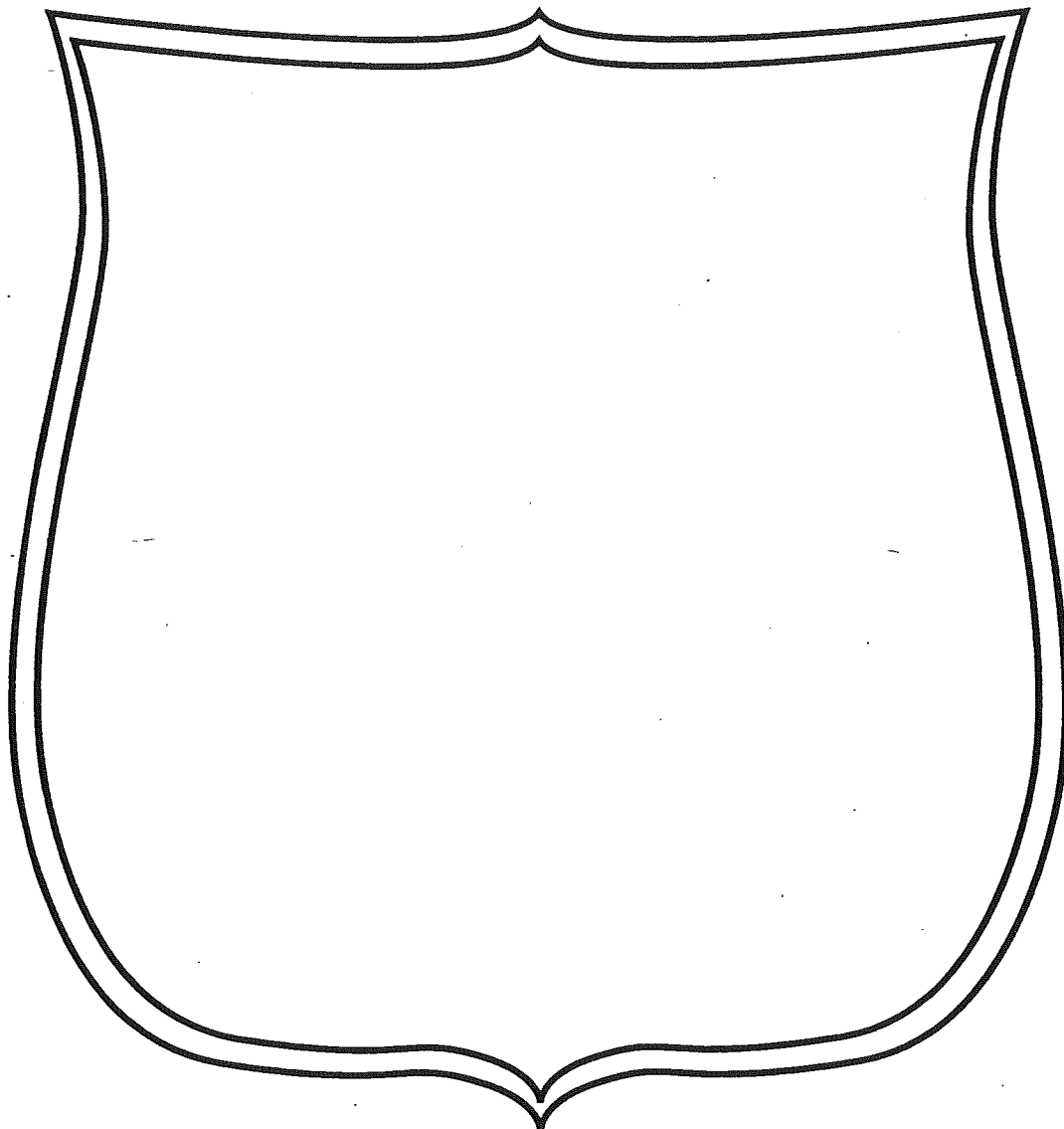
## ACTIVITY SHEET 5-2
