Example of how to put a quote in your response:

Saul’s love for hockey is evident when he says, “But I knew that the loneliness would be dispelled by the sheen of the rink in the sunlight, the feel of cold air on my face, the sound of a wooden stick shuffling frozen rubber”. (73)

- Blend your words in the same sentence as the quote.
- Put a comma right before the quote
- Include the page number at the end of the quote

Another example, this time with the quote at the start of the sentence:

“There are stories of teachers among our people who could determine where a particular moose was, bear, the exact time the fish would make their spawning runs” (58), and this is a similar innate gift that Saul has when it comes to being able to read the plays in hockey.

Yet another example, this time with the quote in the middle of the sentence:

After Saul’s first official hockey game, Father Leboutilier tells him, “The game loves you (77), and the reader senses that Saul has finally found his salvation amid the horrors of residential school.
